Work has been under way for some time on the expansion of the Library at the University College, the projected completion date being sometime in the autumn.

As the result of the success of MUC's application for funds from the province, AMRC has learned it will be assigned a base of operations on the new fifth floor.

The research space will complement the new Special Collections Room, which will house rare materials of special interest to AMRC and other research units.

This is a welcome forward move in the evolution of AMRC. A settled physical location will facilitate the work of the Centre and act as a prime focus for greater campus interest. It is hoped, also, that the proximity of other research groups and a facility for online course development will create a synergy which makes it easy to relate the work of the Centre to the teaching activities of its members.
